



Transforming our energy system – the vision



Energy supply and use responsible for 75% of emissions



Putting the consumer at the centre of the energy transition

- Energy communities are a key tool to increase public acceptance of new projects
- Energy communities are important to mobilise private capital for the energy transition
- Energy communities could increase flexibility in the market







EU legislation on energy communities

- "Citizen Energy Communities" (CECs), Art. 16 of the Directive on the Internal Market for Electricity Directive: recognizes them as new actors in the electricity system
- "Renewable Energy Communities" (RECs), Art. 22 of the Directive on the promotion of the use of energy from renewable sources (REDII): new incentives for citizen-driven transition to renewable energies; rights and obligations of RECs
- REDII, Art. 2 on definitions: makes clear that renewable energy communities are a social concept, rather than for financial profits
- Both concepts overlap when an energy community is active in 100% renewable electricity



Next steps on Promoting Energy Communities

- In order to help Member States with the transposition of the REDII (Deadline 30 June 2021) provisions, the Commission has already funded several studies that provide clear-cut recommendations, building on existing practices at national level, such as the BRIDGE project and ASSET study.
- To further progress in the development of energy communities, the Commission is in the process of setting up an Energy Community Repository in order to capture best practices and advance energy community projects across Europe in the different energy sectors and building renovation context by providing technical support.
- In the spirit of "leaving nobody behind", the Commission will also set up a dedicated European Advisory Hub to provide technical support to energy communities in rural areas.
